

## Accessibility Guide for Rochester Castle

Rochester Castle is located in the centre of Rochester. A large proportion of the Castle is formed of free to access public open space. The Keep, built in 1127, is accessible by steps and has a pay barrier.

As a scheduled ancient monument physical access is restricted. The grounds are fully wheelchair accessible, with an accessible toilet available within the Castle walls.

- There is no visitor parking at the castle, however there is a Medway Council run car park called Boley Hill car park, which is adjacent to Rochester Castle, with a disabled car park just opposite Boley Hill car park.
