
NEW CHILDRENS VILLAGE

Having survived three sieges, the castle has many tales to tell and offers a fantastic view of the festival (view of the Christmas Market). Admission fees apply.

Town centre parking will be extremely limited during the festival. We strongly advise visitors to use the park and ride service, which will operate from the University of Greenwich Medway Campus, Central Avenue, Chatham Maritime, Chatham, ME4 4TB

- Operating between 9am-6pm on both days of the festival.
- Follow the anchor signs (Dockyard symbol), then the yellow park and ride directional signs
- Return pick up point: Corporation Street bus stop outside the Adult Education Centre, Strood-bound carriageway
- Last bus leaves Rochester at 6pm
- £1.50 per adult for a return trip (under 16s free)
